LEADERSHIP REPORT

PAT TESTING

Students in years 1-10 are currently in the middle of the Progressive Achievement Testing (PAT testing) window. Students in Year 1 will complete Reading and Maths tests whilst students from years 2-10 will have an added Vocabulary test. Results from these tests provide teachers with an indicative measure to monitor educational progress and achievement. Further analysis of results allows teachers to further understand individual students and what comes next in their learning.

Featuring information and resources developed by career experts and professionals, myfuture’s theoretical underpinning is inspired by the DOTS model of career education (Law and Watts, 1977). This framework includes four components that are fundamental to career education: Self-awareness, Opportunity awareness, Decision learning and Transition learning.”


What would you do?

Father's Day Raffle







- Click on Settings App







CYBER SAFETY top ten tips for youth

The internet and mobile phones provide great ways to express yourself and communicate with others. It's important to make sure they're used responsibly so that everyone has an enjoyable online experience.
It's all about respecting yourself and others.

- Use a strong password, a combination of upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols, eg P@\$\$w0rd!
- Don't believe everything you read - make sure you know it's coming from a reliable source.
- Don't give out any **private information** over the internet or mobile phones about you, your family and friends, or other people you know. Think about what information you are revealing in a photo.
- Think before you share! Once it's on the internet you can't take it back and it can have a negative impact on your digital reputation.
- Don't hide behind a computer screen, if you wouldn't say it to their face, don't say it at all!
- Don't post inappropriate or illegal content anywhere on the internet.
- Make sure your social networking profile is set to **private or friends only** (check your privacy settings).
- Only accept friend **requests** from people you know and trust - even if it is a friend of a friend it's not a good idea to add them unless you actually know them.
- Tell your friends to ask for your permission before uploading and/or tagging a photo of you, and do the same for them.
- Don't click on any links that are embedded in emails - type the URL into the browser and go from there.

Most importantly, know where you can go for help! Speak to an adult you trust if something makes you feel uncomfortable online or on a mobile phone. You can also contact:

To The Tumby Bay Community,

You may have noticed some changes within our school/community library this term. We are very excited to have the opportunity and time to focus on the vision for our library, to honour the love our school and community have for this space and to share our progress with you.

Our school leadership have recently been informed that there is a significant backlog of the books we are supposed to have ‘weeded’ as a regular process over time in our library. The Public Libraries Board give direction on this and are the ones who make the decisions around this process. We currently have 5000 books on this list, you may have seen the progress of sorting these items if you have recently been in our library. While we feel quite conflicted about removing books, we are unable to purchase any new resources without space to house them. We have also implemented a local agreement that we will not cull any resources which have been borrowed within the last two years or have significance to our local area. In checking with the Public Libraries Board I have been assured that as a general rule, there would be approximately 10 books ‘weeded’ each month and 10 books purchased to replace them. In the future we will definitely not see the amount of books removed as is currently the situation, it is just the significant backlog of the ‘weeding’ process and catching up with this. We are really keen to get on track with this and enable our library staff to buy new books to entice our readers into the library.

The other aspect we would like to re-invigorate is our children’s use of the library as a resource space, to learn about researching, have an exciting and enticing space to enjoy books and participate in events as relevant. We would also love to have the capacity to welcome in community groups, playgroups etc to grow the love of our library. To enable this we are reorganising some of the space within our library to allow this to occur. We have recently had some meetings and consulted with members of the community and TBD Council to discuss this vision for the library and will now continue these conversations with a Library Board about to be re-formed and reinvigorated.

We are aware that there was some mis-information in regards to the school/community library recently and we hope this letter has cleared up some of these concerns, we love that there are people in our community who are as passionate about the library as we are. If you have any further worries or concerns, please come and see me, I’m really happy to hear suggestions and to ensure we are working together


