#### Site Improvement Plan

In a word – TICK! It is really pleasing to have the ‘big data’ back which supports our aim of achieving and maintaining high bands in reading comprehension. Our NAPLAN, PATR and School Performance Report demonstrate this has been achieved in almost all areas. Well done to our students, educators (both teachers and SSOs) and parents who have supported this growth.

#### Facilities

It’s so exciting to have part of our fence completed, and it looks great. Over the holidays our Year 7 & 8 rooms had the ceilings replaced and this has shown a huge improvement and the Year 9 room will be completed asap. Our music room has had extensive shelving added and our music storage is now a lot more organised. The JP playground has been chosen and ordered and we are eagerly awaiting installation. We have plans for the quad toilets to be updated and are even measuring up our staffroom kitchen!!

#### Student Free Day

Our Governing Council have our final SFD for 2021 on Monday of Week 6. Last year we had a day to review our SIP and construct the new edition. This year we are required to formulate a new 3 year plan to continue our push to ‘World Class Education’ and while we are really proud of our achievements to date, we now have some further heavy lifting if we are going to continue to raise the bar.

#### GEM Festival

Our planning continues for the GEM Festival with our Wellbeing Committee in the final stages of pulling this together. The events planned are epic and we are hoping our whole community will come out in support of this initiative. Each class is planning an activity, event or station to engage with positive mental health and will run these on the night.

#### Enrolments for 2022

We are pleased to reflect upon our enrolments for 2022 and are currently looking at 220 students, our highest number for several years. We have a few families moving to the area, students returning from other sites and retention of most students at TBAS which is all good news.

**Covid update** We are pleased to announce some current Covid restrictions in schools have eased. Although we must stay vigilant, the following actions can resume:

- Face mask use for students and staff is now optional.
- Parents, volunteers and visitors are welcome in schools providing COVID safe measures are in place and followed.


