Leadership Report

Hi everyone, welcome to our last newsletter of the term! It has been an exciting term where we have seen some of the results of the expert teaching and learning opportunities at our site and the growth in our student achievement and progress being celebrated.

PAT Testing

Over the last few weeks students have completed the Numeracy and Reading Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT). These tests provide us with another form of data to help monitor progress in these areas. When we analyse these results, we are also able to identify areas of learning that need further consolidation. Analysing this data alongside many other forms of data, including NAPLAN, assists us in deeply understanding what our students can and can't do and what each individual's steps are in their learning journey. We were recently able to share some of this information at Parent/Teacher interviews which was exciting, and we thank those families who made a time to meet and discuss their child/children's learning. We are very pleased with how our students are tracking and the progress that has been made this year.

Preschool Transition

Term 4 will see our Preschool to School transition program shift into another gear. Our Junior Primary staff in collaboration with the Preschool staff always keep the connection between Preschool and School strong, with numerous visits throughout the year. Some final touches to the transition booklet are being made along with confirmation of the dates for transition days. This information will be shared with families soon. In the short term, if you have any queries please contact the school through the front office staff.

R-3 Sports Day and Swimming Lessons

Bicycle helmets

We are a little concerned about the number of students riding to and from school without a bicycle helmet correctly fitted or not fitted at all on their heads. It is the law that when riding, you must wear an approved bicycle helmet that is properly adjusted and securely fastened. An approved bicycle helmet must comply with Australian Standard AS/NZ2063 which will appear on the helmet. If your child/children rides to school please check in with them and ensure they are wearing an approved helmet. Riding on roads can be risky, and helmets can be lifesaving!

Wellbeing Update

Attendance, student outcomes, and participation in sporting events and other extracurricular activities

Every Day Counts! It is vital that students attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education. 95% - 100% (less than 10 days absence in a year) is good attendance. 95% is the national average attendance rate for a child at primary school.

Regular attendance at school is important to a child's learning and development so they get the most from their education. Ensuring regular attendance at preschool and school is a shared responsibility between parents or caregivers, preschools and schools.

Poor school attendance can be linked to several short and long-term adverse outcomes for students including lower academic outcomes, early school leaving, substance use, poverty, unemployment and negative health outcomes.

The attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent.

Extracurricular activities and attendance expectations

While we understand that students need to be away from school when unwell, we strongly encourage other absences to be limited. Our school prides itself with excellent student attendance and will be continuing to focus on this in the future. With our school offering students many extracurricular activities such as sporting events, we advise that these opportunities will be for those students who attend regularly. If a student is not attending at 90% or above, then they may miss out on extracurricular opportunities.

Resilience Project Update

We have an ongoing commitment to use the Resilience Project and focus on continued improvement in student wellbeing.

Why is teaching the resilience project important

Prior to COVID, the *Mental Health Productivity Commission* had identified that young people are disproportionately impacted by poor mental health and suicide and that a focus on prevention and early intervention was critical.

In Jan 2022, The Murdoch Children's Research Institute (MCRI) released a report on *The Indirect Impacts of the COVID 19 pandemic on young people and Adolescence*". It reiterated that not only do we need to support young people in a preventative manner but also "highlighted the importance of **schools** beyond academic learning, where the **social, emotional, and physical** health of children and young people can also be supported".

Providing the tools and interventions to build resilience can significantly **lower the risk of mental illness** and buffer the negative effects of stressful life events. It also references the importance of taking a **long term approach** and that the ongoing provision of the program (across consecutive years) affords greater maintenance of wellbeing.

2023 Material and Services Charge

Proposed fees for Tumby Bay Area School for 2023 have been certified and watermarked by the Department for Education and copies are included in this newsletter. The amounts are \$340 for R-6 students and \$385 for year 7-12's. The school community is invited to have their say on these fees. The fees will be discussed the next Governing Council meeting on Tuesday 22nd November, 2022. Parents are welcome to attend the meeting or put any concerns in writing to the chair of the Governing Council – Sam Stasinowsky


