## Leadership Report



### Preschool Transition



#### COVID Management

Although Covid is currently not as extreme as it once was in our community, there are still some very important protocols in place to help keep it this way. Please remember that students, visitors and staff are not to attend sites for 5 days after being identified as Covid-19 positive and should not be attending schools if symptomatic. Students who are classified as a close contact should undertake 5 rapid antigen tests over a 7-day period following exposure.

\*Students and staff who are Covid-19 positive or are a close contact cannot attend an overnight camp during the 7-day period following testing positive or following exposure.

## Year 12 matters

As our Year 12 students complete the final stages of their Stage 2 subjects and VET certificates, we wish them well and recognise that it can be a stressful time for them. While externally assessed assignments are due over the next couple of weeks, the school assessed work will need to be finalised and sent to the SACE Board for moderation during weeks 4 or 5. Most of our Year 12 students will have at least one exam to sit during week 4 or 5. We thank the RSL for once again, allowing us to use their ideal space for our written exams. We have two electronic exams this year, which will be conducted at school under the expert guidance of our ICT Technician, Bec Burford. Bec has already conducted the SACE-prepared, practice exams with our student candidates so that they have had a chance to become familiar with the software and can concentrate on the content of their exams on the day.

South Australia is leading the way with our rollout of e-exams. As you might expect, the nature of teaching and learning continues to evolve as technology opens up new forms of learning and creative expression for students. E-exams recognise the ways students use computers in their learning and everyday lives. The SACE Board tells us that SACE examinations will continue to evolve, enabling new capabilities to be assessed in new ways.

Our traditional "Farewell Assembly" is planned for Thursday of week 5 (17<sup>th</sup> Nov). This is deliberately timed to be after the exams and when most of the students will have finished their course work. The assembly will involve our Reception students, who will have the job of farewelling their Year 12 buddies as they complete the final stages of their 13 years of schooling. Parents/caregivers of the Year 12s will be invited to a special morning tea following the assembly. Please save the date at this stage with the knowledge that more details will be sent to all Year 12 parents closer to the event.

## Work Experience

Our Year 10 students are currently in the process of planning their week of Work Experience for their last week of term (Week 8, starting 5<sup>th</sup> Dec). They have been thinking about their future career pathways a lot this year, especially while studying PLP and when selecting their subject choices more recently. The opportunity to try out a job to confirm or eliminate the pathway is invaluable. Some Year 11s are also opting to undertake another week of work experience during the same week, when their official schooling for the year is finished.

## CFS training

Six of our Year 10 and 11 students recently took the opportunity to sign up as cadets with the CFS and take part in a Basic Firefighting course in conjunction with some students at Cleve Area School. Year 10s, Lydia, Will and Brody, along with Year 11 students, Thomas, Oz and Tyson spent three big days learning all about the basics of firefighting at Sims Farm during the last three days of Term 3. On behalf of the students, I would like to sincerely thank Brenton Stratford for transporting the group of students to Cleve and back for the course each day. Once their online assessment is finished, the students will receive their official CFS certificate which will lead to 20 SACE points being also awarded to them.


