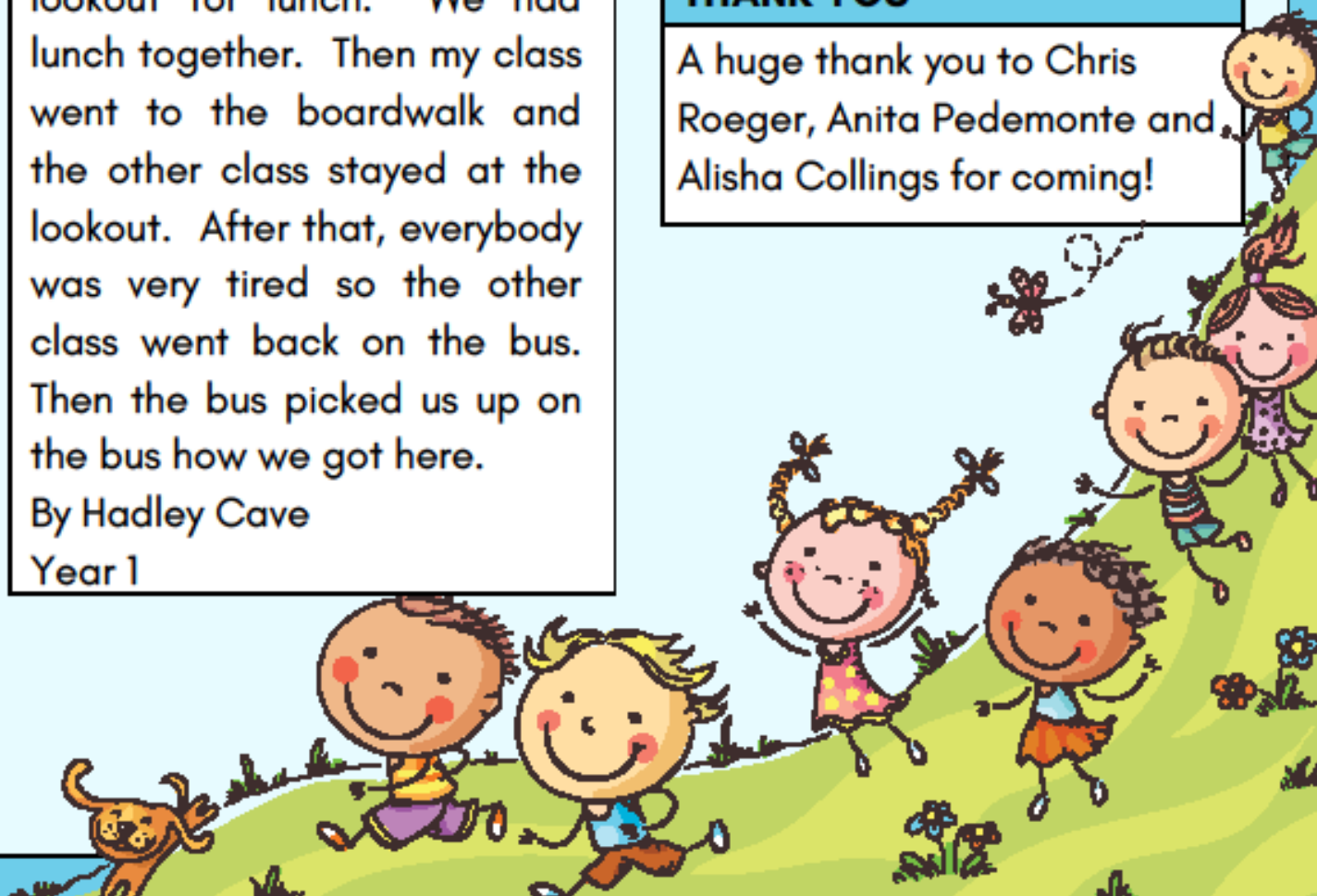

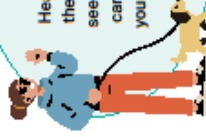

- Work together to support your charity or organisation.

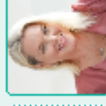
**Neighbourhood Kindness Challenge**
