

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YEAR 8/9 DRANA


ACTORS



What is it & why

Sock Wrestling




Rough and tumble play is another one of the play types that adults sometimes worry about but it is as important as all play. We learn through play and children need to develop these skills necessary to identify real aggression! Sock wrestling photos—objective is to remove the others player's sock while protecting your own, the children LOVED it. Simple rules are to bow-show respect, wish your partner the best, stay-play on the mats only and aim for the sock. STOP is monitored by the educator if needed.

What is it & why—Children who play for example wrestling are both engaged in and consenting to physical play with each other. Issues only arise if the boundaries are crossed and many times the children will work this out for themselves. Educators can assist them to enter deep thinking conversations if they need support. At OSHC by allowing them to experience this they will become adept at recognising when aggression is real and therefore a threat. By allowing them to experience this now, children are learning a life skill—risk assessment and they start to take responsibility for their own health and well-being and that of those around them. This relates to **Outcome 3**: Children have a strong sense of wellbeing, they become strong in their social and emotional wellbeing and take increasing responsibility for their own health and physical wellbeing - see one of our educators if you would like a parenting fact sheet available at OSHC.

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
